We have sole use of the venue for the weekend and will be making use of the facilities including buildings, campsites, fire pits and extensive woodlands to explore.

The theme of our camp this year will be **MEDIEVAL**. We will be doing medieval themed activities all day on Saturday and encourage everyone to bring themed costumes. We look forward to welcoming all the brave adventurers on a quest like no other!

Timings

You are welcome to stay longer for the campfire with your children.

8:00pm Campfire

Sunday 9th June

12:00pm Parents arrive to help break camp.

2:00pm Camp ends - all young people collected from Polyapes

3:00pm Meet at Berrylands Scout Hut to unload and pack equipment away

A full timetable will be made available prior to the event and displayed at the campsite.

Emergency contact details

For any non-emergency communication, please get in touch with leaders via WhatsApp. Leaders will be busy with activities but will reply to you when convenient. Some messages may be sent from leaders via the WhatsApp groups however don't expect regular updates - assume that no news is good news!

In the event of an emergency, contact will be made through a home contact. Leaders may not always be available and could have limited mobile phone communications. The home is a third party who will be able to contact leaders and any information to be passed to emergency contacts will be passed through the home contact. Young people should not have their own mobile phones with them so should not be contacted directly and you should not expect them to check in with you at any point during the camp.


Getting to Camp

Polyapes Scout Camp Blundel Lane Stoke D' Abernon, Cobham KT11 2SL

The campsite is around 20 minutes drive from Berrylands.

Take the A3 to Oxshott. When entering Oxshott village (after the station), turn right onto Steels Lane and follow it until it becomes Blundel Lane. The access to the campsite will be on the right shortly after you cross the railway and is signposted.

When at the campsite, drive through the gates and up the track to the end where you will arrive at the car park.

Kit List

Young people should pack their own kit into a single bag they can carry. It is important that they pack their own kit so they know what they have with them. All items to be marked with your name. We cannot be held responsible for any lost items especially if they do not have a label.

☐ Uniform is to be worn when travelling to or from camp.
☐ Sleeping bag
☐ Sleeping mat (karri mat or self inflating camping mat) + optional pillow
☐ Blanket
☐ Pyjamas
☐ Torch and spare batteries
☐ Camp hat or light sun hat
☐ Spare clothes (at least 2 complete changes in addition to uniform):
☐ Underwear
☐ Socks
☐ Shirt or t-shirt
☐ Sweater / warm jumper
☐ Shorts
☐ Jeans
☐ Trainers
☐ Sturdy outdoor shoes (Hiking boots or wellingtons)
☐ 2 pairs of thick socks
☐ Waterproof jacket and trousers
Wash kit (in a suitable bag): Towel, flannel, toothbrush, toothpaste, soap
☐ Carrier bags for clean and used clothes
☐ Dining set in a named bag (drawstring bags are ideal)
☐ Unbreakable mug
☐ Large unbreakable plate and bowl
☐ Knife, fork, spoon and teaspoon
☐ Tea towel
☐ Coat hanger to hang uniform when not worn (Scouts and Explorers only)
☐ Suntan lotion
☐ Insect repellent
☐ Personal medicines (see note below)
☐ Costume - MEDIEVAL THEME!

Medicines

Any medicines required should be in a named bag that is given to leaders at the start of camp. The medicines should be given with clear instructions of when they are required to be given.

Things that are not required:

Mobile phones - any communication with young people should be via leaders.

Electronics / gadgets - these will get broken or lost and there will be no time to use them.

Snacks - we will provide all required food/drink. Other children may have allergies so we ask that no snacks are brought.

Money - there will be nothing to spend money on and this may get lost.

Please feed young people before sending them to camp. A supper will be provided before bed however this will be some time after arrival at camp.

Breakfast - Cereals and/or Bacon sandwiches


